

GEF Small Grants Programme

The Global Environment Facility (GEF) Small Grants Programme (SGP) that implemented locally by United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) operates on the premise that people will be empowered to protect their environment and livelihood when they are





organized to take action, have a measure of control over access to the natural resource base, have the necessary information and knowledge, and believe that their social and economic well-being is dependent on sound long-term resource management.

The Programme provides support, including but not limited to grants, to non-governmental organizations (NGOs), community-based organizations (CBOs) and civil society organizations (CSOs) for identifying and demonstrating effective community-based approaches addressing local problems related to the global environment.

In Iran, SGP started in 2001 and is presently being implemented in close collaboration with its National Steering Committee which includes representatives from both non-government and governmental organizations.

UNDP's COVID-19 Risk Communication- Community Engagement Initiative

The onset of COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 significantly strained many countries' medical services and disrupted many communities' access to livelihoods. As of April 2020, the Islamic Republic of Iran was the 8th most affected country by the pandemic in terms of the number of people infected by or lost to COVID-19.

The United Nations Country Management
Team in Iran which consists of the UN agencies
and international Non-Governmental
Organizations (INGOs) operational in the
country quickly convened and developed "The
COVID-19 Preparedness & Response Plan
(CPRP)" to support national effort to contain
the pandemic. The CPRP encompasses various
aspects of the support ranging from
coordination to operational support. Guided by
the CPRP and in close collaboration with
Ministry of Foreign Affairs and other national
partners, a one-year humanitarian response
was planned enhance countries' response in
the most affected areas.



The said humanitarian action revolves around two pillars; namely, 1) ensuring uninterrupted service delivery through procurement of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and diagnostic equipment for health and social service provides, Civil Society Organizations, hospitals, and schools and 2) improving the COVID-19 preventive behavior and practices among the most at risk populations to reduce the adverse health and psychosocial effects of the prolonged pandemic. The one-year action is led by UNICEF and includes projects run by UNICEF, UNAIDS, UNFPA, UNDP and Relief International under the two categories previously mentioned.

To operationalize the Risk Communication & Community Engagement pillar, UNDP collaborated with The GEF Small Grants Programme that already had a well-established network of local non-governmental organizations and community-based

organizations that could reach the most vulnerable community groups in remote and hard-to-reach areas. Based on the information publicly released by the government officials, 16 provinces that were most affected by the pandemic were selected (at the time of submission of the proposal to ECHO) and The GEF Small Grants Programme through its delivery mechanism and methodology along with the GEF SGP National Steering Committee approved grants to 27 local NGOs and CBOs in those areas through Low Value Grant agreement.

To ensure that the information disseminated within the framework of this project is on par with the most recent international standards and national guidelines related to COVID-19 response, a Communications Consultant was hired to harmonize content production and assist all the 27 grantees with customizing the content to their local communities' language and specific needs. As the project also aims to develop the capacities of the local NGOs throughout this project, 12 Guidelines covering the most important aspects of the intervention. Additionally, multiple group and one-on-one technical meetings were held with the grantees to ensure that they have access to required assistance.

In addition to the awareness raising sessions by the grantees to the beneficiaries, hand sanitizers and surgical face masks were distributed among the specific target groups in each grant projects.
