### Protecting black-necked cranes in Ladakh, India

Living and breeding exclusively in and around high-altitude wetlands in **India**, **China**, and **Bhutan**, black-necked cranes play an important role in preserving these fragile ecosystems. Feeding on plants and small insects as a part of their diet, the cranes help prevent eutrophication, a process where the overgrowth of plants can decrease oxygen levels in the water and lead to a decline in water quality. 

#### Safeguarding Iran's wetlands through culture-based solutions

Together they embarked on a project to document wetlands biodiversity, traditional conservation knowledge and practices, and the factors leading to biodiversity loss.


